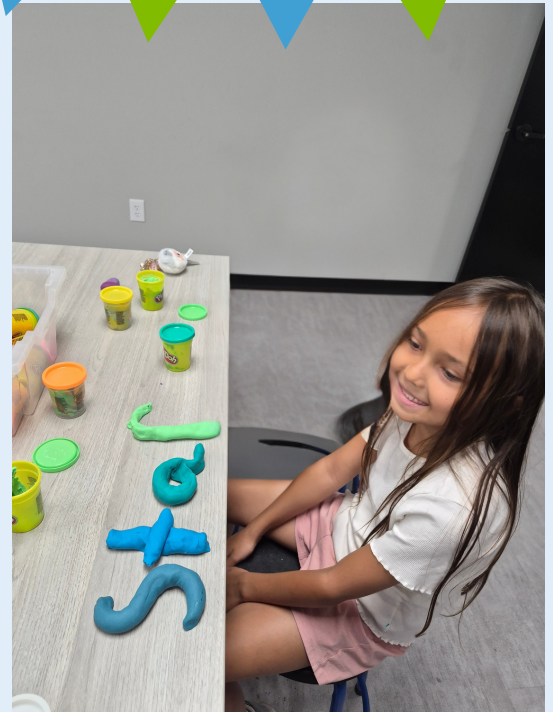
Our Club Experience

Every day in Seminole County, 1 in 4 children live below the poverty line. One Seminole County school reports as many as 20% of their students leave school having no safe, stable nighttime residence. These children and youth risk being unsupervised, unguided and unsafe. Our club is dedicated to providing them a safe & nurturing environment during those critical non-school hours.

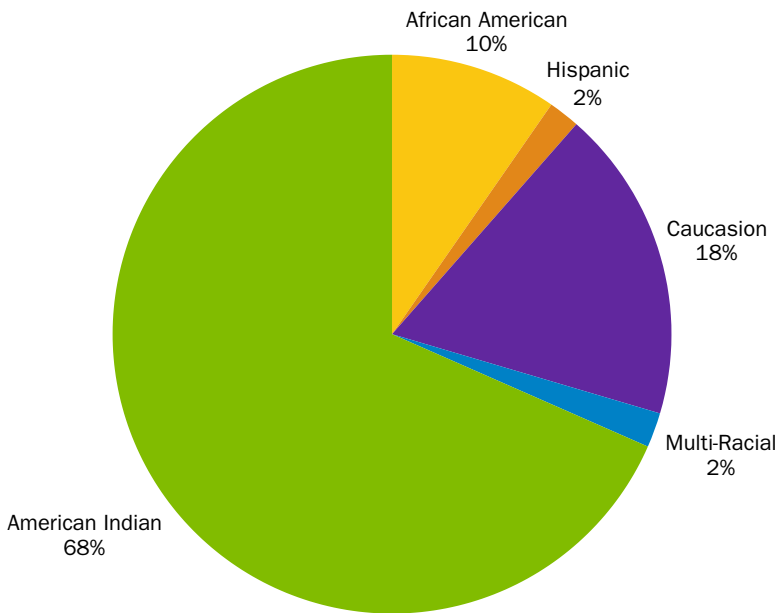

MAY RECAP

During the month of May, Club members finished the school year strong through a variety of educational, workforce development, and celebratory activities!

As the academic year came to a close, members celebrated their accomplishments with an end-of-year party recognizing their hard work, growth, and participation throughout the school year.

Our teen members also participated in a workforce development field trip to Slick City Action Park, where they completed a workforce readiness project and explored potential career paths and employment opportunities.

May also marked the beginning of preparations for the Club's summer programming. Summer program registration opened during the month and reached capacity by noon on the first day of enrollment. Due to overwhelming community interest and support, a waiting list was established and continues to grow.

The Club successfully enrolled 116 youth in the summer program and has averaged more than 80 participants per day since we opened. This strong enrollment reflects the continued trust families place in the Boys & Girls Club and the growing demand for high-quality youth programming within our community.

To support the increased number of participants and maintain a safe, engaging environment, the Club secured additional funding to hire four summer interns. These interns will assist staff with daily programming, activities, and supervision while gaining valuable work experience of their own.

We are proud of our students' continued growth and engagement as we work to provide meaningful opportunities that support academic success, workforce readiness, character development, and positive youth outcomes.

As summer programming gets underway, the Club is preparing to serve more youth than were enrolled during last year's summer program. Strong community interest has already resulted in record enrollment, allowing us to expand opportunities for local youth throughout the summer months.

The Boys & Girls Club of the Seminole Nation of Oklahoma is partnering with Youth and Family Services of Hughes and Seminole Counties to provide a summer program focused on education, recreation, leadership, and personal development. Throughout June, members will participate in weekly swimming trips and educational field trips, including visits to the Oklahoma City National Memorial & Museum, Turner Falls, and other enrichment destinations.

Registration for the Club's July summer session will open in June, and we anticipate continued strong participation from families throughout the community.

We appreciate the continued support of our community partners, families, and stakeholders as we work together to provide safe, engaging, and meaningful summer experiences for our youth.
