The Need in Seminole Co.

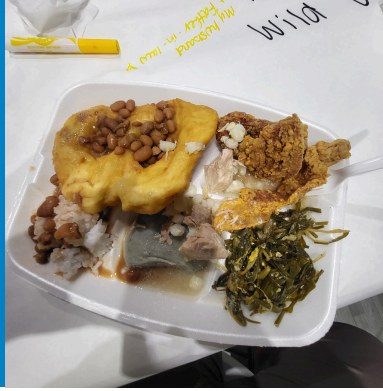

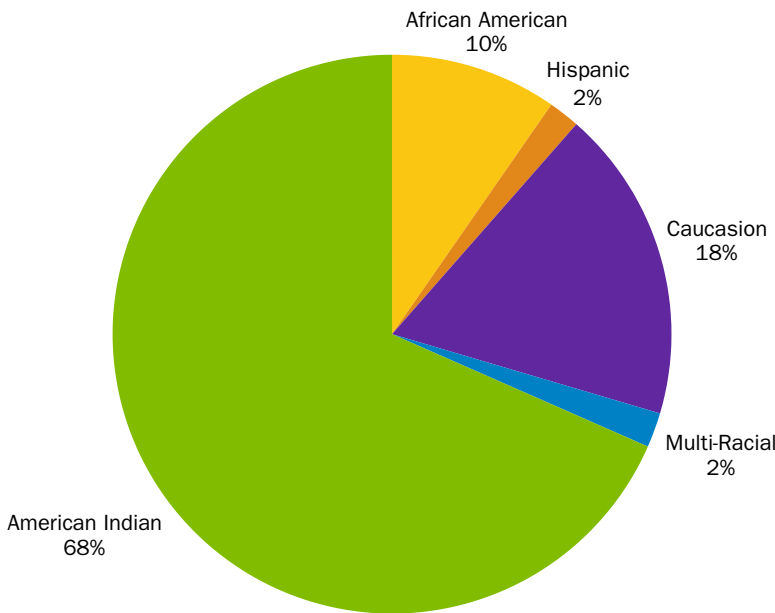

APRIL RECAP

During the month of April, Club members participated in a variety of cultural, educational, and community-based activities that encouraged personal growth, cultural connection, and positive peer engagement.

One of the month's highlights was the Club's Wild Onion Dinner held in partnership with Sand Creek Church. Students, families, elders, and community members gathered to share traditional foods including wild onions, salt meat, beans, fry bread, pork and hominy, blue bread, and other traditional dishes. The event provided students with an opportunity to learn from elders, strengthen cultural connections, and experience the importance of sharing traditional foods and community fellowship. Members also participated in a Club-wide Easter egg hunt that encouraged teamwork, fun, and positive social interaction among students of all ages.

Club staff represented the organization at a Tribal Resource Fair, where they connected with community members and partner organizations while raising awareness about Club programs, services, and resources available to local youth and families. The event helped strengthen community partnerships and expand outreach efforts throughout the area.

Additionally, members completed an affirmations project focused on building self-confidence, positivity, and emotional wellness. Through this activity, students created encouraging messages for themselves and others while learning the importance of healthy self-image and supporting their peers. We are proud of our students' continued participation and growth as we provide opportunities that support cultural identity, community engagement, and overall youth development.
