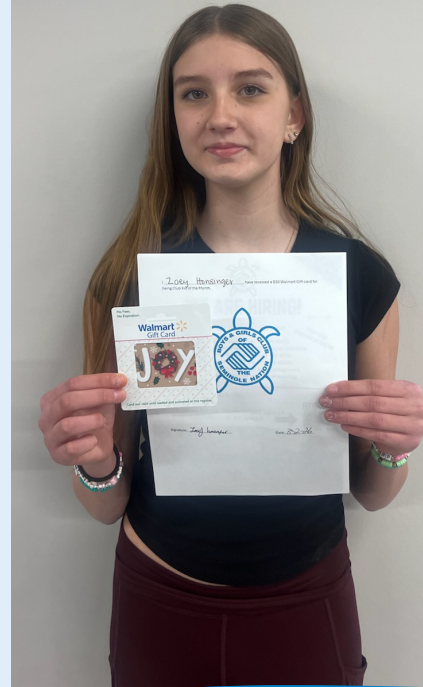
Our Club Experience

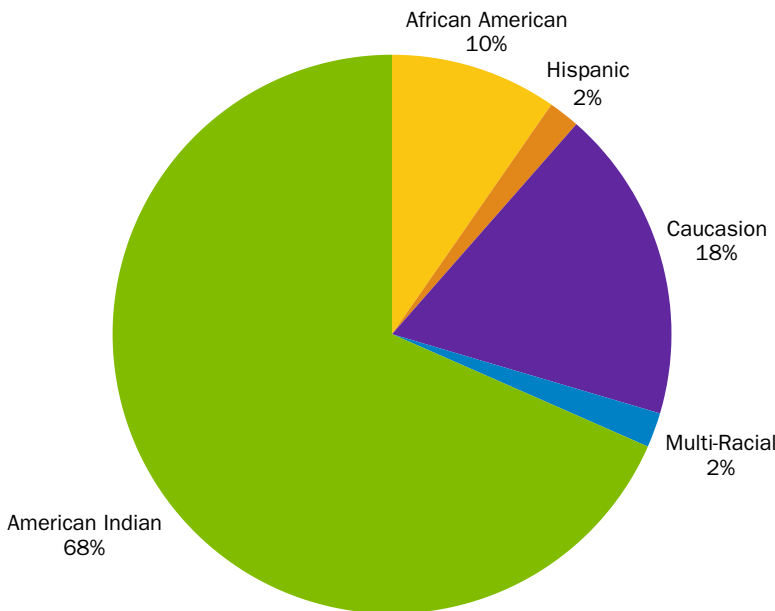

FEBRUARY RECAP

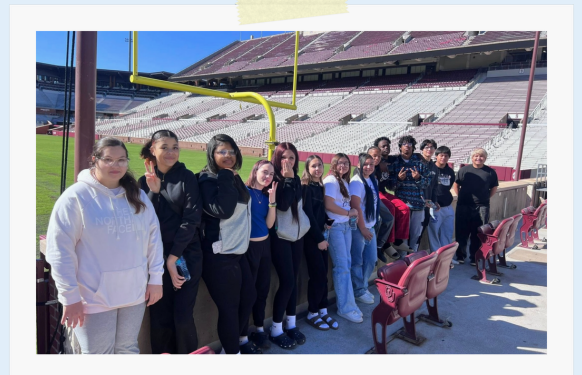
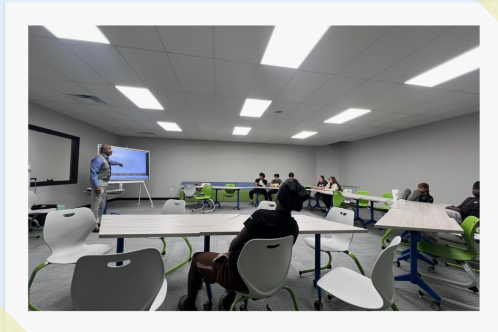
